

Morrow County Hospital Invests in New CT Scanner

In our ongoing commitment to provide high-quality expert care to the community, Morrow County Hospital recently acquired and installed a state-of-the-art non-invasive heart imaging machine that's a new 64-slice CT scanner.

"This new equipment ensures our patients have local access to high-quality CT technology and reduced radiation doses," said Leslie Dye, manager of Cardiopulmonary and Imaging Services.

For patients with blood clots, infections, or cancer, early diagnosis results in timely treatments and improved outcomes. In an emergency situation, this new CT equipment may be lifesaving because the technology is faster and provides improved quality images of bones, organs, and internal bleeding over the older, less advanced CT systems in just minutes.



that is simply longer than most patients with advanced pulmonary conditions can manage. With the new 64-slice CT scanner, it will only take approximately 10 seconds of actual scan time to obtain images that will allow physicians at Morrow County Hospital to not only give prompt diagnoses but also improve patient outcomes and save lives.

"Our goal is to provide prompt and accurate diagnoses as quickly and thoroughly as possible," Dye says, "the installation of the 64-slice CT scanner will help us accomplish that."

The reduced scanning time offers many other advantages. For example, it can be difficult for young children to hold still for the longer times required with older scanners, and patients with breathing problems often find it difficult to hold their breath for 30 seconds or more, since


Cancer Care Close to Home
